STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS



The 2016 Conference will explore the artistic development and powers that shaped Medieval Paris since Merovingian times. A full programme of lectures and visits has been arranged. Speakers include Meredith Cohen, David Coxall, Michael Davis, Jana Gajdosova, Alexandra Gajewski, Lindy Grant, Sarah Guérin, Emily Guerry, James Hillson, William Chester Jordan, Terryl Kinder, Jeffrey Miller, H el ene Noizet, Christopher Norton, Anna Russakoff, Dany Sandron, Christopher Wilson and Katherine Wilson.

There will be site visits to Notre Dame including the upper parts, St Denis, Saint-Martin des Champs and walking tours on the right and left bank of the Seine to include less familiar sites such as the College des Bernardins, Maison d'Ourscamp, St -Etienne-du Mont and the refectory of Ste-Genevieve. All site visits will be on foot apart from a trip on the Metro to St Denis.

Applications are invited for student scholarships. The conference will run from 2pm on Saturday 16th July to lunchtime on Wednesday 20th July, 2016. Scholarships will only be awarded to those who can attend the conference in its entirety. The scholarship will cover the lectures site visits, 3 buffet receptions, two lunches, and coffee/tea during the lectures. Students are expected to make their own travel arrangements and to find their own accommodation although there may be a small discretionary amount towards accommodation for those unable otherwise to take up an offered scholarship.

Applicants should email Kate Milburn (catherinemilburn@madasafish.com) enclosing a brief CV, at least one academic reference and a brief statement on the reasons for wanting to attend the conference. The deadline for applications is **Sunday 1st May**. Applicants will be notified by 15th May. Please note that it is the responsibility of the applicant to send the academic reference with the application; the BAA will not chase references.

Scholarships will be allocated by the members of the BAA council and are usually given to those studying medieval art, architecture or archaeology at postgraduate level. The scholarships are funded by the generosity of BAA members and the number awarded varies according to the funds available. Successful applicants are expected to join the BAA if not already members.
