### STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS



The 2018 Conference will explore the art, architecture and archaeology of medieval Cambridge and the surrounding area, including papers on “priors, hospitals, colleges and parish churches in and around Cambridge, early sculpture, stained glass and wall paintings, manuscript illuminations, seals, coins and nineteenth-century antiquarianism”. In Cambridge there will be site visits to King’s, Great St Mary’s, and Jesus College; walking tours exploring south and north Cambridge will include St Benet’s, Corpus Christi Old Court, Gonville and Caius College, Little St Mary’s, Queens’ College, St Michael’s, Trinity College, The Round Church, and St John’s College. A coach excursion outside Cambridge will encompass Great Paxton, Madingley Hall, Ickleton, Whittlesford, Duxford St John’s and Hadstock.

For those who wish to stay on there is the possibility of additional site visits on the Wednesday afternoon, details of these will be included in the joining instructions.

Applications are invited for student scholarships. The conference will run from lunchtime on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> September to lunchtime on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> September, 2018.

Scholarships will only be awarded to those who can attend the conference in its entirety. The scholarship will cover the lectures and site visits, accommodation for four nights, three dinners, two receptions, three lunches and refreshments throughout.

The deadline for applications is **25<sup>th</sup> May 2018**. Applicants will be notified by 8<sup>th</sup> June 2018. Please note that it is the responsibility of the applicant to either send the academic reference with the application or to make sure their nominated referee sends it in; BAA will not chase for references.

Scholarships will be allocated by members of the BAA council and are given to those studying medieval art, architecture or archaeology at postgraduate level and those who have been awarded research degrees in these areas within the last two years. The scholarships are funded by the generosity of BAA members and the number awarded varies according to the funds available. Successful applicants are expected to join the BAA if not already members. The maximum number of conference scholarships that can be awarded to an individual is two.
